Born in 1750, John André came from a Huguenot family of silk merchants who had emigrated to England in the 1740s. Entering the army in 1769, John rose quickly, becoming Britain’s spymaster in New York at the height of the American Revolutionary War. Captured in 1780 while on an important mission behind enemy lines, he was hanged by the Americans. In recognition of his bravery, George III commissioned a monument to him which stands in Westminster Abbey.
