### Reader fee

There are no reader fees.

### Copying

This applies to copies taken for private study only. Please enquire regarding commercial reproduction charges.

- **Use of digital camera (for personal visitors to the Library)**

The use of a digital camera is allowed, free of charge, if in accordance with Copyright regulations. Visitors can take up to **50 images per day**.

Please contact the Librarian and fill in a request form detailing each item if you wish to digitize any material in the collection.

There are no photocopying facilities available in the dedicated reading room at The National Archives where the Huguenot Library is housed.

- **Digital images requests from the Librarian (via e-mail or letter)**

Readers can request digital images to be taken from:

- Printed material
- Family Research Files
- Wagner Pedigrees
- Items in the archive (not bigger than A3)

Please note that some items may not be photographed because of their fragility or because the request would not be in line with Copyright regulations.

Readers need to provide exact references of the items that they wish to have digitized.

The maximum number of images that the Librarian can take is capped at 30 per request.

Depending on the number of requests and work involved some delay may occur in supplying images.

These photographs are not taken by a professional photographer; if you require high resolution digital images please contact the Librarian.
